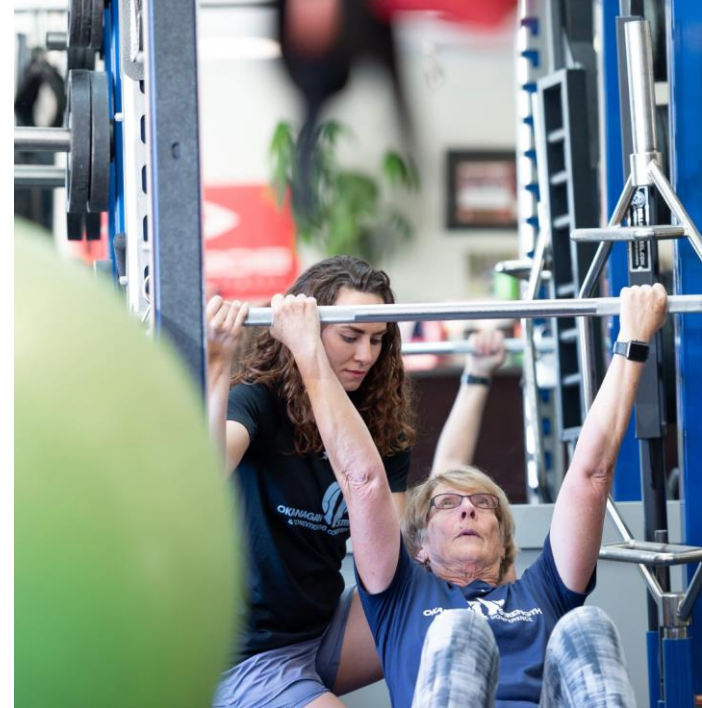
Co-op Program Overview

- Work Intergrated Learning
 - An experiential learning opportunity to see how classroom interests translate into possible career paths
- Full time, competitive, paid work experiences



Co-op Program Overview

- Collaborative & competitive job search
 - Continuous support
- Co-op credits are additive – they **DO NOT** replace required or elective course work
- Flexible sequencing of work terms (MUST complete your degree on an academic term)
- Designation (3 Work Terms)



Eligibility Criteria

- ✓ Undergraduate studies: Arts, Fine Arts, Health & Exercise Science, Management, Media Studies, Sciences, Sustainability
- ✓ Domestic and international students
- ✓ 3rd Year Standing
- ✓ Cumulative Average of 70% or higher*
- ✓ Previous work / volunteerism / projects

*Applicants with GPAs below 70% are still encouraged to apply; applications are assessed on multiple factors including communications, teamwork, maturity and demonstrated career motivation.

Why **Interdisciplinary** Co-op?

- “What do I want to do after I graduate?”
- Work for different organizations, industries, or positions
- Opportunity to learn what you like vs. don't like
- Building transferrable skills
- Gain industry contacts and experience
- Enhance classroom learning (value of course work, new areas of interest, minors/ majors/ honors projects etc.)
- Tailored supports



Co-op Career Readiness Curriculum (CRC)

- Self-paced on Canvas with in-person sessions each term
- Mandatory
 - Must be completed prior to first work experience. (Takes place alongside your academics)
- Benefits:
 - Critical career development skills



Co-op Job Search Student Supports



- Co-op positions are competitive and not guaranteed
- Exclusive access to the Co-op Job Board
- Guidance for students sourcing positions through other avenues
- Applications (Cover Letter, Resume)
- 1:1 Interview practice with Advisors

Co-op Program Fees

There are 2 fees associated with the Co-op Program*

- Refer to [Academic Calendar](#) for up-to-date fees

****All fees are the same for international and domestic students***

1) Co-op administration and workshop fee

- One-time fee, non-refundable
- Due upon acceptance into the program
- Waived for Indigenous Students



Co-op Program Fees

2) Co-op is a recognized course – each 4-month Co-op work term you secure must be verified and registered under a Co-op course code (i.e. COOP 401, 402, 403)

- Subject to undergraduate course tuition fees – same for all students (Domestic & International)
- Only registered in this course when you secure a position (self-sourced or from UBCO Co-op Job Board)
- Fee is due at the start of each 4-month term
- Regular student service fees are charged in addition



Co-op Work Experiences: Sequencing

- Designation
 - 3x 4-month terms (12 months total)
- Students do not take Co-op work experiences + academic courses at the same time
- Co-op credits are additive – they do NOT replace required or elective course work
- Flexible options
 - Additive programs i.e. Go Global
- **MUST** graduate on an academic term
